Reporting to Parents

- All curriculum areas will be covered across the year. Note in some cases different outcomes for certain learning areas will be covered in different semesters. For example, depending on the year level, Digital Technologies and Design and Technologies will be reported in different semesters.
- Semester 1 & 2 reports will available on Connect at the end of Week 9 in Term 2 and at the end of Week 9 in Term 4 for Pre-Primary to Year 6 students.
- Kindergarten reports in Semester 1 are hard copy with Semester 2 being available on Connect.
- Parent Interviews are also held in Week 10 Term 2. The school has an early close of 12 noon on Wednesday 28th June, 2023.

Sun Safe

- Burrendah PS is Sun Smart school.
- The school has NO HAT NO PLAY IN THE SUN policy.
- All students are asked to wear a school uniform.
- Please name all hats and clothing.
- All students without hats will be sent to a shaded area during break times.
- Sun safe reversible bucket hats, not caps, are the endorsed school hat.

Students ill at School

- If your child is ill they should not be at school.
- If your child has had a fever, vomiting or diarrhoea in the previous 24 hours please do not send them to school.
- If your child does not attend school please phone Reception or email the class teacher via Connect.

Lice

 Students will be requested to go home if live lice or eggs are detected in your child's hair. They can return to school once the lice have been treated.

Medication

- Staff can administer medication if required only when paperwork has been completed by the parent/guardian. For short term medication requirements, parents/guardians are requested to complete the 'short term authorisation' form available from the classroom teacher.
- For 'medic alert' students completed medical action plans are to be completed in consultation with the parents and the Deputy Principal.
- If your child has any form of asthma please inform the office and provide the necessary puffers. Do not leave asthma medication in school bags for children to administer independently without teacher supervision.

Parent Helpers - Confidential Declaration

 Parents who assist in classrooms or on excursions etc., will be required to complete a declaration form of confidentiality. This process is a legal requirement to help safeguard students.

In-School Activities and Excursions

- Throughout the year, in-school activities and excursions may be arranged to support the long term goals
 of the school and classroom learning programs.
- Please return all notes and monies within the time frame requested.
- Please speak to the Manager Corporate Services (MCS) if you are having financial difficulties and a plan for payment can be drawn up.
- The wearing of full school uniform is considered essential for students representing the school and going on school outings.

School Communication

- Connect is a learning, support and communications platform developed by the Department of Education WA for staff, students and parents in public schools. We use Connect as our main communication tool with parents.
- The school's website (http://www.burrendahps.wa.edu.au/) provides value information about the daily operation of the school, plans and policies, curriculum, enrolments and community and classroom events. Please note that the school calendar has links to additional information, such as school excursion notes.
- An online newsletter will be emailed to parents usually each fortnight per term. See the term calendar for dates.
- SMS messages or Connect will also be used to send an alert to parents of urgent matters or coming events.
- Emails to specific groups within the school community are also used to communicate with parents.
- Mobile phone numbers, work contact numbers and email addresses must be kept up to date so we can communicate effectively and also make contact in an emergency.

Online Learning

- Connect is a very important platform to deliver online learning. With this in mind we need to ensure students from Kindergarten - 6 have access to this platform.
- All student will be given logon cards to support them to access Connect and online packages as required.
- The Department of Education Learning Hub will also support online learning from K –
 Year 6.

Birthday Cakes

- Burrendah Primary School has a Healthy Food Policy which excludes lollies, potato chips and chocolates. Lolly bags cannot be distributed by class teachers.

Assemblies/Open Classrooms

- This year we intend on holding Community and Faction Assemblies throughout the term.
- Usually a Community Assembly will include the presentation of a class item. Pre-primary to Year 6 will attend this assembly.
- Faction Assemblies are mainly for students and are run by the student leaders.
 Parents/guardians are welcome to attend.
- In addition to Community and Faction Assemblies, we will also hold special assembles for events such as Harmony Day, ANZAC Day and NAIDOC.
- In 2023, we intend on continuing Open Classrooms which were very popular in 2022.
 These usually take place on a Friday morning for approximately 30 minutes and provide
 parents/guardians an opportunity to share their child's learning journey. See the calendar
